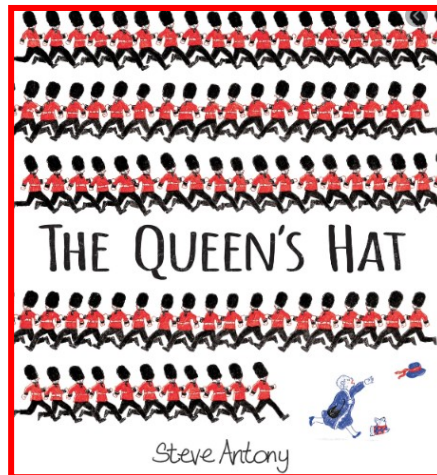


Lakeside EYFS and KSI Home Learning

Daily Essentials

English

Use the 'Twinkl Live Lessons' Phonics videos on Youtube. There are a wide range of videos to choose from but we recommend using Phase 2 (blue) or Phase 3 (pink). After you've learnt that sound why not use your sound mat to practice

Maths

Count to 100 everyday. Find your favourite character to help you count to 100.

Order, read and write the numbers up to 20.

Weekly Choices

Spelling words

Learn to spell set three common exception words.

Number

Try to recall your doubles—Ask your grown-up to quiz you... E.g. If they say 3, can you quickly tell them the double is 6?

Wider curriculum

When you are outdoors, Play a game—maybe football or tennis or have a race with your grown ups

Capital letters

Practise forming all of the letters in the alphabet correctly.

Now you know the lower case letters, can you learn to write the capital letters?

Number

Using your finger double knowledge, start to work out half of a number. If you hold up 4 fingers (2 on each hand) and take away 2 fingers, you are left with 2.

Double 2 = 4, Half of 4 = 2

Wider curriculum

When you go on a walk, count how many rainbows you spot.

If you haven't already, make a rainbow to display in your window.

Capital letters in names

Capital letters are used at the start of someone's name. Can you write a list of your friends and family, using capital letters to start.

Shapes and measure

Use a timer on your grown-up's phone or other device and time yourself doing activities— E.g. How long does it take you to get dressed?

Wider curriculum

Can you keep your bedroom tidy? Help with things such as making your bed and put away your toys.

Design a brand new hat for the Queen. Make it as special and creative as you can.



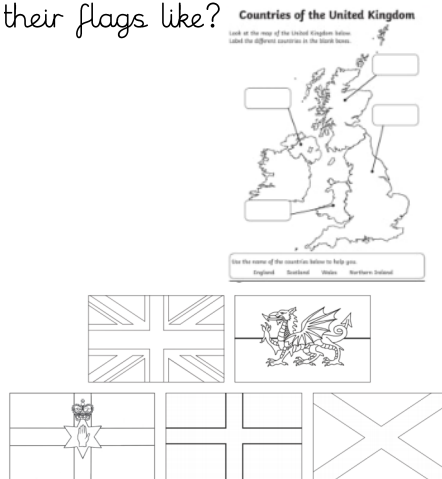
Using creative resources, make your own very special party hat or crown.
