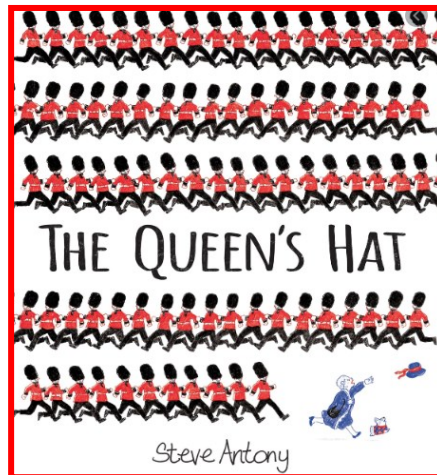


Lakeside EYFS and KSI Home Learning

You can also tick off your weekly choices, (REMEMBER: pick a minimum of 1 a week from each colour)

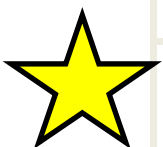

Design a brand new hat for the Queen. Make it as special and creative as you can.



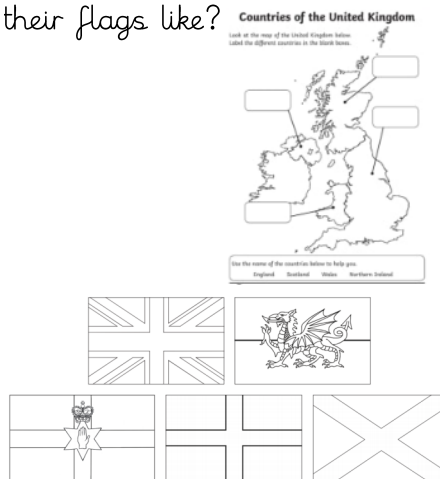
Using creative resources, make your own very special party hat or crown.

How much does each ice cream cost? Look at the coins and write the total amount on the circle.



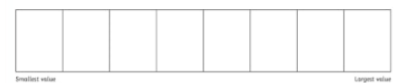
How much money is in my jar?
